

## Local man works to restore Camp Reynolds historical marker

**PYMATUNING TOWNSHIP** — At 10 a.m. Dec. 19, the Camp Reynolds State Historical Marker was hoisted into place and perched atop a pole, taking its rightful place after being missing for more than 13 years.

The blue historical marker is located just below where the camp's headquarters had been and where the original flag pole still stands, along state Route 18, North Hermitage Road near 10th Street.

According to Art Williams, project manager of the Camp Reynolds Project, the historical marker which was originally erected in 1994.

by a vehicle in 1999 and stolen, and had been missing for 13 years.

In June 2013, the marker was recovered by Williams, with the help of Dion Magestro.

The damaged marker was repaired and put back up by Clearfield Electric, owned by Les Turner, who has a state contract to repair state historical markers.
