Eye-Witnesses Absolve Shenango Race Troops

CAMP SHENANGO, Pa., July 22—In an effort to set fact from fiction in a similar manner for the soldiers here last week between colored and white troops at Shenango Post and Replacement depot, where one Negro was killed and six others wounded, the Mercer County NAACP branch has submitted the following information to Secretary of War Hottel:

(I). Inadequate living and recreational facilities at the post for colored troops.

(II). Overcrowding of that portion of the camp assigned to colored troops.

(III). No colored chaplains or commissioned officers on the post. (The Courier learned this week that Chaplain Argelious E. Martin has assumed his new duties at Shenango, coming here from Camp Lee, Va.)

(IV). Failure of the commanding officer to prevent the handings of weapons surrounding the riot, as well as regarding the riot as just a passing incident.

(V). Lack of courtesy towards soldiers and citizens by white mil-

tary police.

(VI). Relaying of only that part of the facts of the case which might incriminate the colored soldiers and influence the minds of the reading and listening public.

The Pittsburgh Courier, conducting its own investigation, has signed statements from several eye-witnesses of the affray which cost the life of Pvt. Norman Taylor, 23, of Rosedale, Kan.

"A group of white boys started out by kicking one of the colored boys' eyes out," one stated. "Of course the rest of the colored boys couldn't stand up and see this happen, so they started throwing rocks. All this happened near the theatre where the colored soldiers usually go in the evening.

"The boys in the theatre were asked to stay where they were, but some left," he continued. "At this point the MP's could easily have taken things in hand by administering tear gas, but instead they drew guns and shot into the crowd, killing one soldier. Although the colored boys were unarmed, they threw rocks hitting one lieutenant in the head. Many believe he is dead.

"The colored boys then went to their supply rooms, getting their guns and ammunition, and started to blast away at their opponents.

"The paper states that there were only colored soldiers hurt, but there were about 12 whites shot. . . out of the 12 there are possibly three dead," he concluded.

"SOLDIERS THROWN OUT"

Another witness said: "Two Negroes went to the white post exchange. There was no direct order for Negro and white soldiers not to go into each other's post exchanges, until after the riot. Anyway, white soldiers threw the colored soldiers out, something we had never done when they came to our post exchange. Other Negro soldiers, hearing the incident, went to the aid of those two soldiers. White MP's took sides with the white soldiers and tried to get the mass we had formed. Knowing we could not win, our mass gathered around the colored theatre.

"Now, here's what happened: The white MP's came into our section of the camp around the theatre and began to fire, killing one soldier. Some Negroes ran for cover; others went direct to the warehouse to get guns and ammunition.

"TRED CONTINUOUSLY FOR SEVERAL HOURS"

The Negro troops took their positions and fired continuously for several hours. I don't know how many white soldiers were killed or injured. The riot ended with special troops surrounding the battle area and taking cover."

Other reports were in the same vein as the two quoted above. As reported last week, six Negro military police were cited for bravery for their action in the riot.

As this is written, no official report from post headquarters has been released revealing the names of the slayer. No complete casualty list has been made public, although a board of inquiry has been investigating the case.

Early reports of the riot did not state that colored MP's were involved, nor the fact that white troops were casualties in the disturbance at Shenango.

Race Chaplain At Shenango

SHENANGO, Pa., July 22—Chaplain Argelious E. Martin has taken over his new duties at the Shenango Post and Replacement depot, coming here from Camp Lee, Va. He has been in the Army since July 28, 1942, and has been administering to the Negro component of the Army since that time.

Of the Methodist denomination, Chaplain Martin is a graduate of Clark university and the General Theological seminary, both in Atlanta, Ga.

He wife, Mrs. Olivia E. Martin, is living in Petersburg, Va., and his two sons are governmental employees. There are two nephews in the service, one overseas and the other taking an Army course in Atlanta. In civilian life the chaplain made his home on the eastern shore of Maryland.






